



## Kansas City Regional Counterterrorism Response

Training Opportunities from the Training and Exercise Subcommittee of the Regional Homeland Security Coordinating Committee

*The Kansas City Regional Law Enforcement Counterterrorism Team is dedicated to preparing law enforcement officers in active countermeasures against highly motivated and trained attackers. This is accomplished through hands on training that is specific to interoperability, small team tactics and communication. With medical personnel, we work together to stop the killing, stop the dying, and care for those affected.*

### Overview:

This eight-hour course is locally developed by regional police officers and tactical medics. It was developed for regional first responders who will be exposed to and then asked to demonstrate techniques related to countermeasures when engaging with motivated attackers. This instructor-led training will start with classroom instruction which will build to demonstrated techniques and end with practical application scenarios involving simunitions.

### Course Objectives:

- Enter, move to and engage a crisis point within a complicated residential and/or commercial structure that is occupied by a well-equipped and well-organized terrorist cell with a small group of officers.
- Execute a hasty entry in a critical incident to prevent the loss, or further loss of life.
- Demonstrate safe weapons handling and muzzle control as presented in training.
- Sustain effective contact and disruption of the criminal/terrorist's goal(s).
- Demonstrate non-electronic communication and coordination procedures.
- Learn terminology and tactics which will be used by attendees across the region.

### Special Notes:

Participants will need to bring conversion kits for their weapons and supply their lunch and drink intake for the day. It will be a working lunch.

Simunitions and safety equipment are provided.

# Tactical Operations for CBRNE Incidents (PER-221)

LSU NCBRT/Academy of Counter-Terrorist Education provides Department of Homeland Security (DHS) certified courses, taught by expert instructors, and will deliver all course materials to your training facility at no cost to your agency.

## Course Summary

The goal of this course is to provide tactical team personnel and emergency responders with the knowledge, skills, and abilities to safely and effectively respond to chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive (CBRNE) incidents.

Through a combination of classroom sessions and comprehensive practical exercises, participants gain knowledge and experience in decontamination procedures; selection and use of PPE; tactical operations involving an IED; identification and characteristics of chemical and biological agents; identification and characteristics of radiological isotopes; use of detection equipment; and planning and performing tactical operations in a CBRNE environment.

## Target Audience

The target audience for the **Direct Delivery** version of this course is law enforcement tactical team personnel and hazardous materials personnel or other emergency responders who may have a role in CBRNE response.

## Priority Registration for Regional Law Enforcement and Hazmat

**45% tactical = 12-14 from LE/ SWAT**

**45% hazmat = 12-14 Fire/Hazmat**

**10% EMS = 2-3 from EMS**

## Prerequisites

All law enforcement course participants will be sworn members of a federal, state, local, or tribal law enforcement agency who are currently assigned to and functioning as members of a fully operational law enforcement tactical team. Additionally, participants may be responders trained to the hazardous materials operations level or above with responsibilities for supporting tactical teams as part of their duties.

All participants should be cleared by their respective agencies to don PPE and participate in physically demanding practical exercises.

It is recommended that in order to attend this course, law enforcement participants should have completed the following:

- Incident Command System (ICS) courses 100, 200, and 700
- An awareness-level WMD course
- A training program in basic tactical operations

It is recommended that in order to attend this course, Fire/HazMat participants should have completed the following:

- An awareness-level hazardous materials course
