REQUIREMENTS:

For this process, sworn members with no change in employment status, must have an Academy graduation date on or before **11/22/2022** as recorded in HRD.

Sworn members who have separated from employment and/or lateral sworn member's, must have been re-appointed or appointed on or before **11/22/2022** as recorded in HRD.

Years of service completed with KCPD, or any other law enforcement agency, prior to a sworn member's current appointment/re-appointment date will not be counted to establish the years of service eligibility requirement."

In addition, officers must also be able to meet the following requirements:

- Two (2) years minimum experience as tactical or detective experience for Fugitive Enforcement Detective.
- Demonstrate high level of integrity, sound judgement, and decision making through past work performance.
- Be responsible for all assigned equipment, to include the maintenance and security of that equipment
- Attend and participate in specialized training.

- Maintain a high level of physical performance and participate in physical training.
- Maintain reliable and predictable attendance.
- Capable of working flexible hours/days on short notice.
- Willing to accept a minimum two (2) year assignment.
- Will be a liaison to all KCPD investigative elements assisting with tracking cases submitted, returned, declined and charged.
- Receive and process all state warrants issued by Jackson County, Missouri, courts.
- Serve and Return all state warrants to the court.
- Have the ability to facilitate and maintain accurate records of all fugitive extradition cases.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills with fellow team members, supervisors, other department and non-department elements and law enforcement partners.
- Demonstrate detailed organizational skills, time management and the ability to multitask.
- Proficient in office software and law enforcement databases.
- Maintain reliable and predictable attendance.

All interested qualified law enforcement members who meet the above requirements must submit a Request for Transfer, Form 4 P.D., to the Human Resource Division (HRD). One copy of the Request for Transfer must be submitted through the chain. In addition, one copy of the Request for Transfer, a completed Selection Process Candidate Review Form, Form 417 P.D (with chain of command endorsements), and a resume must be submitted to **Sergeant Anthony Hernandez, Fugitive Apprehension and Arraignment Section**, no later than **May 8, 2026**.
