

KCPD Citizens Wheel School

The KCPD Motorcycle Squad will be hosting a Citizens Motorcycle Training.

This class will be held at the KCPD Regional Police Academy driving track on **April 4th, 2026**. Hours will be **0800hrs-1600hrs**.

KCPD Citizens Wheel School is a course designed to introduce riders of all levels to techniques taught to and used by law enforcement motorcycle operators. This is a **free** one-day course to develop and help improve motorcycle skills for everyday use. The class will be held on KCPD's driving track and will give attendees instruction and opportunity to perform maneuvers on a closed course.

The KCPD Citizens Wheel School will give participants instruction and on-cycle drills to develop and improve downed motorcycle recovery, slow motorcycle operation optimizing "Clutch, Throttle and Brake", at speed counter steering, threshold breaking, curve negotiation and braking in a curve.

The class size is limited in number to provide participants time and space to allow all riders enough time per exercise. While we understand that things happen in life, *please only reserve a spot if you are sure you plan to attend*. This has been a very popular class and we plan to increase the frequency when it is provided.

To participate in the class, we require all attendees to have reserved a spot with the Sergeant in charge. Participants should have a motorcycle that can be legally operated on the street and have a motorcycle license/endorsement or learner permit equivalent.

Required Equipment:

Street Legal Motorcycle

Eye protection

DOT certified helmet

Gloves

Long pants

Boots or footwear that covers the ankle

Leather jacket or heavy coat

Please note this is **NOT** a substitute to an accredited motorcycle safety course such as MMSP or MSF. Participation in this course is not a substitute for a riding proficiency demonstration requirement for Missouri DMV licensing.
